Seasonal fun for the children

Discover two family-friendly festive tales this winter at Stratford children's story centre

ith the countdown
well and truly
on – and not many
sleeps until Christmas Day – now is
the time to get the whole family
in the festive spirit with some
seasonal shows for children.

Percy the Park Keeper's Winter Park and Glitterbugs are both coming to Discover Children's Story Centre in Stratford.

The shows, aimed squarely at the youngest members of the family (six and under) are running daily in the build up to Christmas, although there is no Monday showing of *Glitterbugs*.

Discover have produced the shows themselves in the hopes of bringing families together this festive period.

Percy the Park Keeper's Winter Park takes families on a tour of a sparkling winter world for a fun, interactive performance based on Nick Butterworth's delightful book After the Storm with music and puppets.

The story is narrated by Daniel Naddafy, who tells the story of what Percy does after a winter storm blows down the old oak tree that his animal friends lived in.

Director Stephen Harper said:
"We took the book and simply told
the story. Then we tried to bring
the lovely pictures to life.

"The puppets help the characters to leap off the page. It's wonderful to see how the children relate to the animals loving the individual personalities - the steady badger, the frenetic squirrel and the nerdy mole."

Actor and puppeteer Daniel said: "Working with the puppets to create Percy the Park Keeper's Winter Park has been challenging at times, as we've created a whole range of different characters and personalities – from slow

and serious badger to the sleepy rabbits and overexcited squirrel, who all have different quirks and levels of energy.

"The children really engage with the animals and immediately pick their favourites – squirrel and mole are very popular, and you can feel the excitement in the room each time they come on stage."

After the show, the audience will take part in a craft workshop

creating a glittery Christmas decoration to take home.

Daniel added: "The puppets really bring the story to life and make it feel like there's a whole company of actors on stage, rather than just one"

Glitterbugs offers a shiny winter haven with puppets, stories and songs for the very young.

The two performances will also be joined by an exhibition of children's laureate Michael Rosen's Bear Hunt, Chocolate Cake and Bad Things for the Christmas holidays. The exhibition itself will continue running all the way until Sunday, April 10.
